

**Job Posting:
Environmental Education Intern**

The Bay Area Restoration Council (BARC) is offering one full-time position starting in May 2019.

JOB DESCRIPTION:

The successful candidate will assist with the delivery of BARC's school programs, outreach events and communications. The role would predominantly consist of leading environmental educational programs at local schools. Other roles may include: participating in Hamilton's Children's Water Festival, operating a booth at outreach events (I.e. 100 in 1 Day and art crawls), leading guided hikes (i.e. Jane's Walks and McMaster student groups), and creating content for our Online Community Forum.

ELIGIBILITY:

- Registered as a full-time student in the previous academic year and intend to return to school full-time in the upcoming academic year
- Between the ages of 15 and 30 (inclusive) at the time of intake/selection
- Canadian citizens, permanent residents, or persons who have been granted refugee status in Canada
- Be legally entitled to work according to the relevant provincial/territorial legislation and regulations
- Vulnerable sector screening will be required (paid by BARC)

QUALIFICATIONS:

- Experience working with children
- Passion for environmental issues
- Demonstrated ability to work without supervision
- A valid driver's license and regular access to a vehicle

SCHEDULE AND RATE OF PAY:

Schedule will vary, but is for 30 hours/week for eight weeks at a rate of \$15 per hour. Some evening and weekend work will be required.
